It has become well established that under the Xi Jinping administration, the Chinese dissidents, intellectuals, rights-defending lawyers and reporters have faced unprecedented suppression and persecution. In order to study these deteriorating political circumstances in the country, China Transform Study Institute based in Australia has joined the New York-headquartered China Alliance for Democracy, Federation for a Democratic China, *Beijing Spring*, New School for Democracy in Taiwan, and other overseas Chinese democracy organizations, to host an international conference "2015: China's Democratization Process and the Evolving Relationships between the Mainland, Taiwan and Hong Kong". - 4) the changing practice of "one country, two systems" and its impact on the mainland-Taiwan relations.

In addition, meetings with local politicians and community leaders will be arranged during the conference.

At a time when the Chinese party-state is emerging as an assertive authoritarian global power, we believe that organizing such a conference is crucial. We look forward to turning the Sydney conference into a fruitful event with our joint efforts and active participation.

As organizers of the conference we will provide 3 days complimentary accommodation, meals and local transport to all invited attendees.
